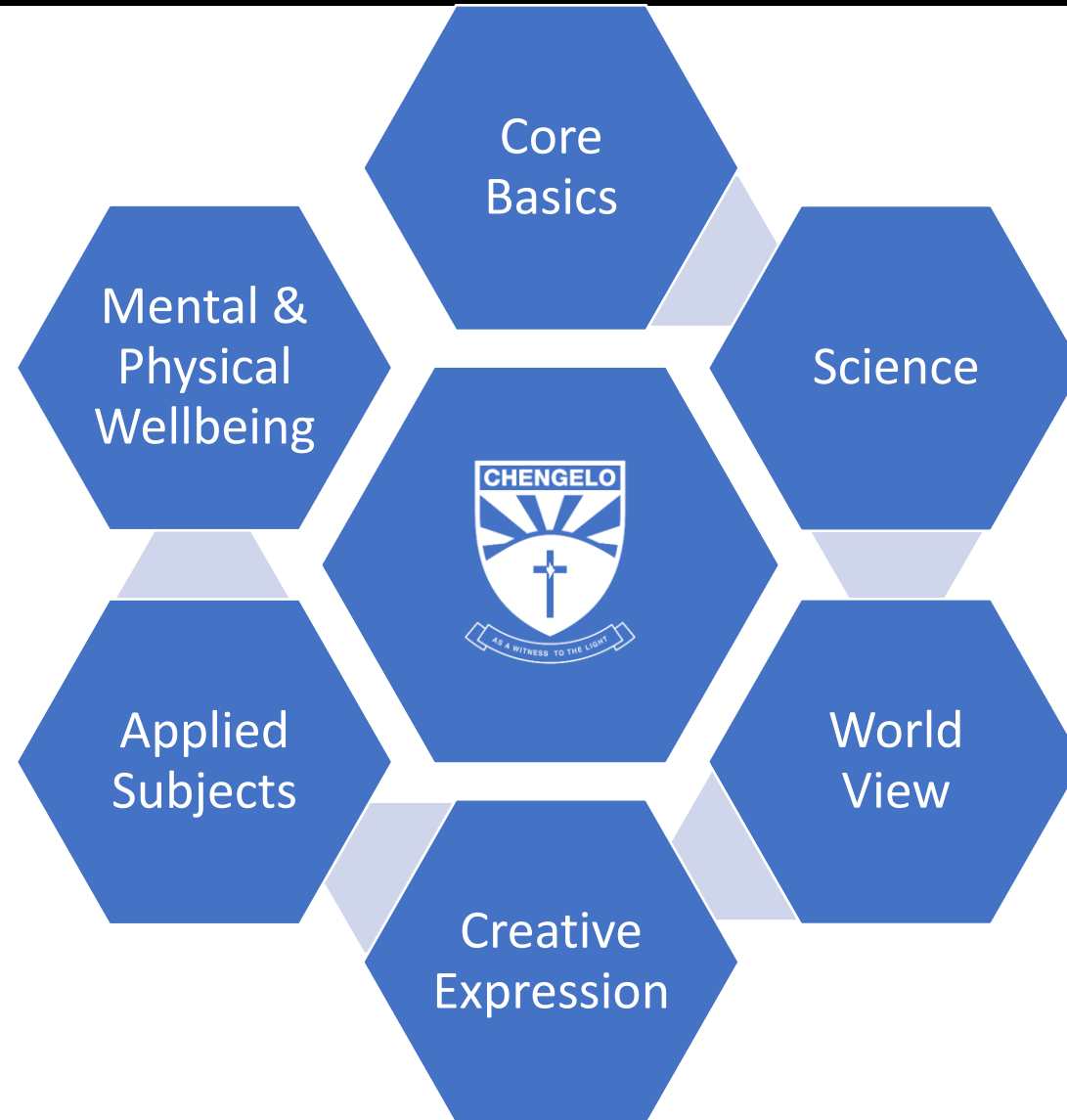
- IGCSE is too early to narrow your child's options or to be set on a future plan

Forbidden combinations

Students **should avoid** taking the following combination:

Art & Design AND Design & Technology

Students are warned to **exercise caution** with selecting too many coursework-heavy subjects such as Design & Technology and Agriculture.

Be careful not to channel too early: e.g. triple science, geography, design and technology, computer science... unless there is a real passion for this area.
